



Dr. Paba Palihawadana is the Deputy Director General of Public Health Services, Ministry of Health, overseeing all communicable disease control programmes in Sri Lanka. She graduated from the Faculty of Medicine, University of Colombo in 1986. She obtained her masters and the doctorate in public health in 1993 and 2000. She served as the Chief Epidemiologist/Director of Central Epidemiology Unit and in-charge of the Expanded Programme of Immunization in the Ministry of Health Sri Lanka from 2008 to 2017. She worked as the immunization specialist for Unicef, India in 2017. She also has worked in the WHO/SEARO region in 2003, 2004, 2008, 2010, 2013 and 2019 as a short term consultant to review AFP Surveillance activities, Controlling polio outbreaks, preparation of guidelines on measles and rubella surveillance for the Expanded Programme of Immunization in Bangladesh, Myanmar, Timor Leste and Indonesia. She was a member of the Strategic Advisory Group of Immunization of Experts of WHO (SAGE) and a member in the SAGE working group of Japanese Encephalitis, Varicella and rubella. She is a visiting lecturer, examiner and a member board of study in community medicine in the Post Graduate Institute of University of Colombo. She has authored research related to vaccine preventable diseases and other communicable diseases and has several publications to her name.
